

Jack and Jill of America, Inc. Montgomery County, MD Chapter Jack and Jill of America, Inc.

Jack and Jill of America, Inc. was founded January 24, 1938 in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania by twenty Mothers under the leadership of Marion Stubbs Thomas. They came together to discuss creating an organization to provide social, cultural and educational opportunities for youth between the ages of 2 and 19. We are dedicated to nurturing future Leaders by supporting children through leadership development, volunteer service, philanthropic giving and civic duty. Jack and Jill is divided into more than 230 local chapters within 7 geographical regions in the United States.

Montgomery County, Maryland Chapter

In October 1962, the Jack and Jill of America, Montgomery County, MD Chapter (JJMCMC) was chartered with Henrietta Franklin as the chapter organizer. Over the years, JJMCMC has become an integral part of the Montgomery County, MD community, exposing children to educational and cultural opportunities, extolling the importance of community service, and helping them develop leadership skills and life-long friendships.

JJMCMC Group V Annual Civil Rights History Tour

JJMCMC Group V is comprised of mothers with children in middle school. Prior to COVID-19, during the MLK weekend for four consecutive years, Group V embarked on an annual Civil Rights History Tour to various locations to obtain rich cultural experiences in our African American history. Previous tours included trips to: Birmingham, Montgomery, and Selma, AL; New Orleans, LA; Memphis, TN; Gullah culture in Charleston and Johns Island, SC.

This year we are excited to continue this tradition with a visit to the birthplace of Jack & Jill and experience Philadelphia's deep African American history. Our tour includes visiting:

Museum of the American Revolution

The museum uncovers and shares compelling stories about the diverse people and complex events that sparked America's ongoing experiment in liberty, equality, and self-government.

African American Museum in Philadelphia (AAMP)

The African American Museum in Philadelphia is the first institution built by a major United States city to house and interpret the life and work of African Americans.

Johnson House Historic Site

Johnson House sits right along Germantown Avenue and is Philly's only accessible and intact stop on the Underground Railroad.

Marian Anderson Historical Society & Museum

A renowned opera singer of the 20th century, Marian Anderson called this three-story house her home in Philadelphia.

African Episcopal Church of St. Thomas (AECST)

The first black Episcopal Church in the United States. Originally established as the African Church, The African Episcopal Church of St. Thomas was founded in 1792 by and for persons of African descent to foster personal and freedoms and self-determination.
