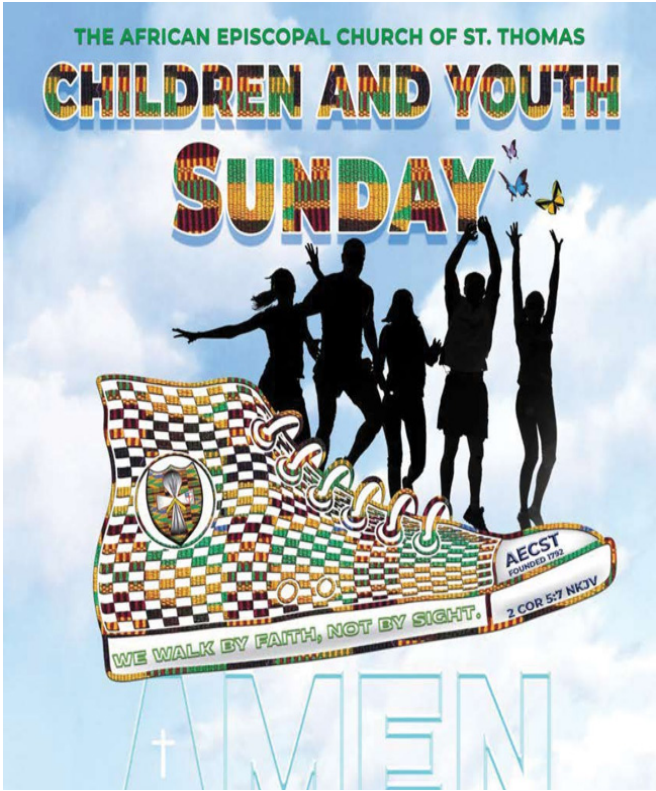
One way to show our love and welcome is to provide him with a gift card as he transitions to a new city (i.e. Target, bank cards, etc.)
