
A RECTOR'S REQUEST FOR DONORS

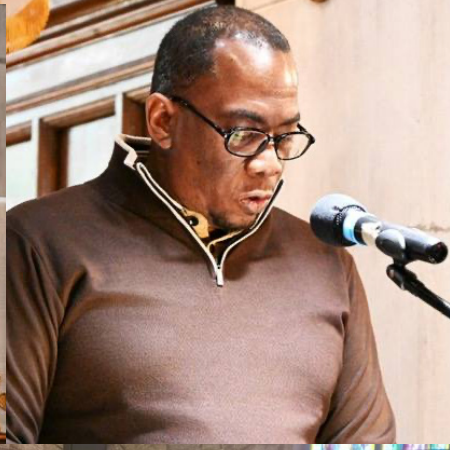

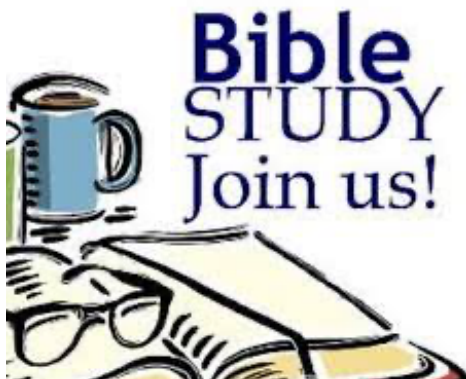
