# Movie Premiere AIN'T NO BACK TO A MERRY-GO-ROUND

Upcoming premieres in LA, Philly, NYC and coming to a city near you: Ain't No Back to a Merry-Go-Round, the new film by Emmy-award winner Ilana Trachtman (Praying with Lior, Mariachi High, Black in Latin America) recounts a forgotten watershed moment in Civil Rights Movement history: the first time Black students and an organized white community, largely Jewish, joined forces to protest segregation. At our painfully divided moment, this hopeful film offers an opportunity to explore social justice activism, the powerful promise of partnership, and the potential each of us has to provoke change. Ain't No Back received Best Documentary Feature at the DC.

Black Film Festival, the Audience Award at the Boston Jewish Film Festival, and has been selling out screenings around the country. Filmmaker Ilana Trachtman will attend for talkbacks in Los Angeles on 1/19, NYC on 1/29, and Philadelphia on 2/6, and the film has upcoming screenings in Hartford, New Orleans, Mobile, Florissant, Atlanta, Cincinnati, Boca Raton, Albuquerque, and Portland too. 



# HOW CAN I BE FAITHFUL TO GOD AND THE CHURCH THROUGH STEWARDSHIP? "To whom much is given, much is required." -Luke 12:48
