
SPECIAL RECOGNITION AT ANNUAL WOMEN'S DAY CELEBRATION


The Reverend Canon Thomas Wilson Stearly Logan, Sr. Memorial Prize

The Schuylkill Deanery of the Episcopal Diocese of Pennsylvania The Very Reverend Canon Martini Shaw Dean of the Schuylkill Deanery

Since 2015, the Schuylkill Deanery has recognized student scholars by offering **The Rev. Canon Thomas Wilson Stearly Logan, Sr., Award.** This award, which has had a profound impact on past recipients, is provided to students at churches within the Schuylkill Deanery who have demonstrated exceptional academic achievement, community service, and a strong commitment to their faith.

Fr. Logan served as the Rector of Calvary Church Northern Liberties, one of eight churches that comprise the Schuylkill Deanery. He was named Rector Emeritus when he retired in 1984. Upon retirement, he became Associate Priest of the African Episcopal Church of St. Thomas. At the time of his death in 2012, Rev. Canon Logan was the eldest serving African-American priest in the Episcopal Church.

On Saturday, **June 8, 2024**, the Union of Black Episcopalians (UBE) Philadelphia Chapter and Calvary St. Augustine Church will celebrate the ministry and service of the **Reverend Thomas Logan**, who was a civil rights pioneer and a long-term leader of the Conference of Church Workers Among Colored People (CCWACP), which was the precursor to the Union of Black Episcopalians. His contributions to his hometown of Philadelphia went beyond that of being a parish rector.


