2024 JAY BARRY HARRIS HERO OF THE YEAR

Nikki Franke was a member of the 1976 and 1980 U.S. Olympic Fencing teams, and was the USA Fencing National Foil Champion in 1975 and 1980. Coach Franke launched Temple's women's fencing team from scratch, building a club team into an NCAA Division I powerhouse.

During her 50 years of coaching, she amassed 898 victories, making her one of the winningest collegiate coaches in fencing history. She was the first and only Black female Head Coach of an NCAA Division I fencing program when she retired in 2022.

Franke is a graduate of Brooklyn College, and received her Master's and Doctorate Degrees from Temple University. She is an Associate Professor Emerita in Temple University's College of Public Health, where she taught for more than forty years.

Dr. Franke also co-founded the Black Women in Sport Foundation which focuses on introducing youth to non-traditional sports and mentoring women of color involved in all aspects of sport.

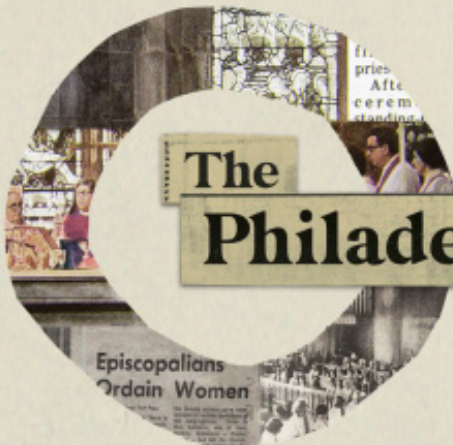
She has been inducted into five Halls of Fame and has received numerous honors for her trailblazing and successful career.

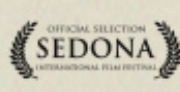

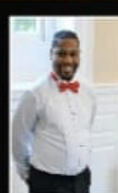

Memorial Prize**

**The Schuylkill Deanery of the Episcopal Diocese of Pennsylvania
The Very Reverend Canon Martini Shaw
Dean of the Schuylkill Deanery**

Since 2015, the Schuylkill Deanery has recognized student scholars by offering **the Rev. Canon Thomas Wilson Stearly Logan, Sr., Award**. This award, which has had a profound impact on past recipients, is provided to students at churches within the Schuylkill Deanery who have demonstrated exceptional academic achievement, community service, and a strong commitment to their faith.

Fr. Logan served as the Rector of Calvary Church Northern Liberties, one of eight churches that comprise the Schuylkill Deanery. He was named Rector Emeritus when he retired in 1984. Upon retirement, he became Associate Priest of the African Episcopal Church of St. Thomas. At the time of his death in 2012, Rev. Canon Logan was the eldest serving African-American priest in the Episcopal Church.

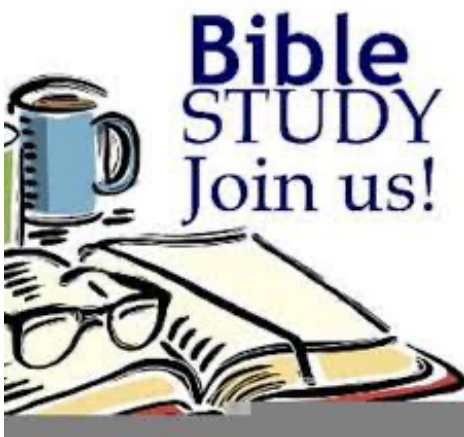
