The Honorable Lori A. Dumas was elected Judge of the Pennsylvania Commonwealth Court in 2021. She is the only person of color to serve on the nine-member court. During her 20 years of service in the Philadelphia Court of Common Pleas, Judge Dumas presided in every major trial division of the court.

Her commitment to the citizens of Pennsylvania is personified through her extensive contributions to women, children, and victims, while leading many innovative initiatives, such as the nationally renown First Judicial District's Human Trafficking Court.

Her work with victims has been both locally and nationally recognized. Judge Dumas has held memberships in numerous organizations, including, the National Council of Juvenile and Family Court Judges, The Mann Center, Dream Camp Foundation, Penn's Village, and the National Campaign to Stop Violence. She is also a member of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc. and the LINKS. Inc.

Since being elected to the Commonwealth Court, she has been appointed by the PA Supreme Court as a member of the Judicial Ethics Advisory Board and has had several notable judicial opinions published. Judge Dumas is a graduate of North Carolina Central University School of Law and Duke University. She holds Executive Certificates from Georgetown, the University of Pennsylvania, and Cornell University.




